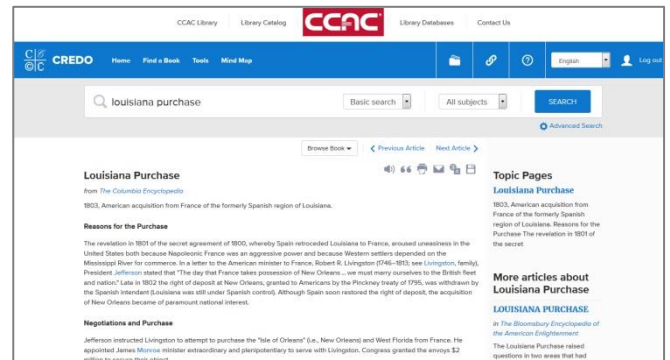
Academic eBooks and Article Databases

Our [eBook collection](#) through Ebscohost includes over 50,000 titles (mostly academic) that can be viewed on computers and mobile devices.

Math Café

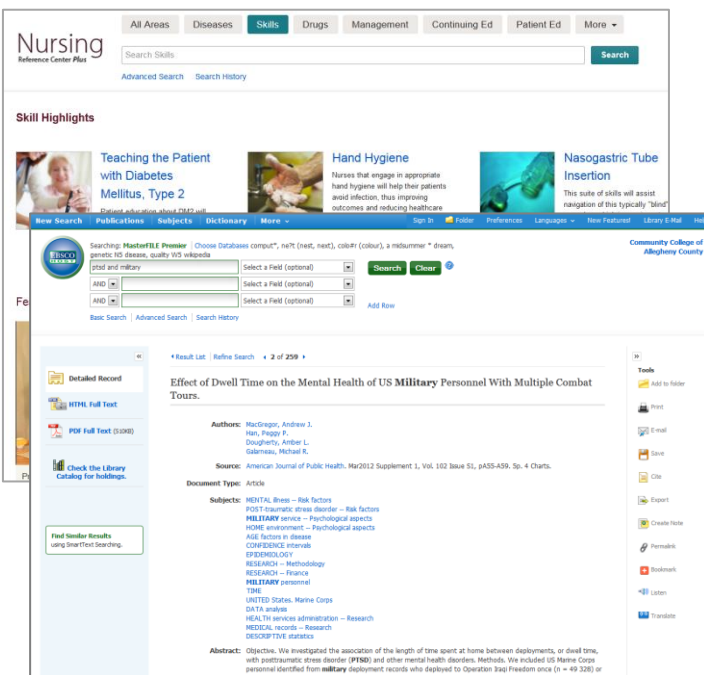
The [Math Café](#) is a place where students can drop in and receive math help in a comfortable environment.
